Uniform Dress Code

The Children's Storefront has adopted a uniform dress code for the year 2005 – 2006. It has been approved by the Parent Advisory Board, the Board of Trustees and the Faculty. It will be enforced beginning day one of school. It is considered a part of school policy that students will come to school in uniform. This dress code is designed to allow parents to purchase clothing where they choose: department stores, thrift shops, or uniform stores.

Policy

Students will be required to follow the uniform dress code beginning on the first day of school, September 2005 and thereafter. When the students are given a dress down day, they may wear their choice of clothing, however, no logos with obscene, vulgar pictures or messages will be allowed. Consequences for being out of uniform:

- Parents will receive a warning or a call that their child is out of uniform and will be expected to bring necessary clothing to get child into uniform. Parents may take the child home to change. Repeated offenses will not be tolerated.
- The Head of School and the Director of the Upper School reserve the right to make any exceptions to the rule, giving warnings or chances to a family.

Preschool and lower school:

Navy Blue: skirts, jumper; pants and shorts, must be worn at the waist with a belt as appropriate.

White or light blue tops with a collar - peter pan, turtle neck, button down, polo, Nehru, etc. no tee-shirts allowed.

Navy Blue or white sweaters, sweatshirts or jackets are allowed

Shoes - uniform or regular shoes, not sneakers

Upper School:

Khaki skirts, jumper; shorts and pants, must be worn at the waist and belts required as needed

Navy or khaki/tan sweaters, jackets (no logos on jackets or sweaters)

Navy or White tops with collared shirts, Peter pan, button - down, turtleneck, Nehru etc.

Shoes - uniform or regular, not sneakers

Gym Uniform

Navy blue shorts/sweatpants

Storefront t-shirt/sweatshirt

Sneakers and socks

Misc. details

The only logo shirts allowed are the Storefront shirts for gym

Blue jeans are not acceptable pants

Shoes/boots must not have heels higher than 1.5 inches

Jewelry must not pose a danger.

Shorts must be at least gym short length, no short-shorts.

Skirts will be worn no shorter than 3 inches above the knees, as measured when kneeling

Dress Occasions

Every student in upper school must have available a dress outfit. This means a skirt or dress pants outfit for girls, a jacket, slacks and tie for boys. Velour sweat pant outfits are not acceptable. These dress outfits will be needed for certain occasions during the year. Trips to the theatre, to corporate settings, etc. are included in those events.
