

Tech Saturdays Info Sheet • Do NOT give us the \$30 until you get selected via the lottery and have a confirmation number!

We at The Children's Storefront work with the Wireless Harlem Initiative to provide free computers to families with children in grades K-12. The schedule for Tech Saturdays is on our www.techsaturdays.org Web site.

What is Tech Saturdays? This is a NYC area program to provide free computers to families with children in grades K-12. It was started in Fall 2007 by Steve Bergen from The Children's Storefront in Harlem working with the Wireless Harlem Initiative (www.wirelessharlem.org).

How to Sign Up? You must get onto our Tech Saturday e-mail list. If you do not have e-mail, then you must find a friend or relative who will send an e-mail to ts@cstorefront.org for you. You will then get notifications of Tech Saturday dates.

What Happens Next? You or your friend/relative will be contacted by email when and where the next Tech Saturday is. If you want to be the lottery, you will be asked to include the first name of the child along with his/her grade and name of the school where the child attends. You will then be in the lottery. If you are chosen and given a confirmation number, you will have several days to bring the \$30 in for the workshop and to agree to these rules via email.

- Yes, I understand that a child plus an adult must attend the computer workshop that last for several hours.
- Yes, I have paid \$30 cash or money order (no checks allowed, sorry). I understand that this fee is to cover the workshop and that the computer itself is free.
- Yes, I understand that this computer "is what it is" and that it is an old refurbished computer that has been loaded with legal and free software. I understand that the only way I can get a replacement of any component is at the next Tech Saturday. I am NOT allowed to come to The Children's Storefront to seek a replacement of any computer.
